The Junior and Senior High Youth Groups continue to be led by Sara & Larry Brown. The Sunday School continues to under the leadership of Greg Dunkerton. The two Small Groups were combined into one group, and that group continued to meet biweekly. One of the new activities was several new social get-togethers organized by Lisa Liebowitz.

Yet, as we know, the church lit Kenilworth is neither the building, nor all the different activities – it is the people who gather together to worship and serve our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ that make up his church. And what matters is not the size of the building or the plethora of activities and ministries, but the spiritual health and growth of each one who attends Kenilworth and has made it their church home. Building and Grounds Maintenance

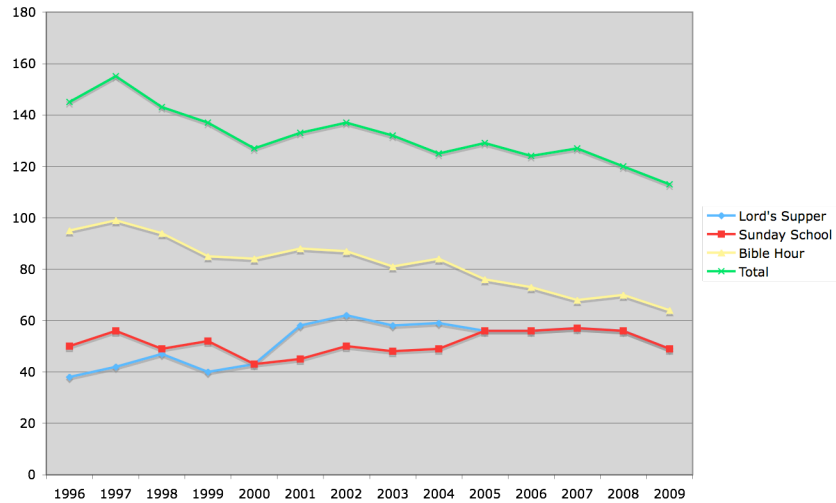

Testimonies of inmates show that the courses save souls and notes of thanks have come from inmates for the teaching and guidance the courses and the Bible provide. More than a few times inmates have written that God has saved them from death in the streets by incarceration and then 'called' them to His Son, saving them from the second death of Rev 20:14. The bondage of sin can be broken in these difficult places.

Bibles are also supplied along with helpful Christian literature on various subjects. The Emmaus Ministry is still healthy in the face of godlessness which is growing in this age as the Bible teaches, Questions are asked by inmates and Bible based answers are given, which at times leads to correspondence and is a blessing for both sides. Both sides need encouragement to continue on and our Lord provides.

The big event once a month is more of a time for the two to come together and work with each other in the hopes that bonds will form between the older and younger teens.

We have been encouraged once again in our numbers and are excited to see that God has blessed these youth groups with so many amazing young people. Both groups can average anywhere from 5-20 with the combined events having seen between 20-40. While good portions of the teens from KGC attend our events, the majority of our groups are made up of friends of church members or others from the community. God continued to introduce challenges to us this year. With His help we have been working on teaching the younger group to not only respect us as leaders but also to respect each other. 2. Nametags are available in box outside Chapel office.
3. The Greeters list is posted on bulletin board outside the chapel office. Those unable to make their assigned date can trade with other Greets or find someone to cover for them.
